


- Forest and Forestry Management Law (Decree 6070/2008)



Final Considerations

Perspectives for a 3D Cadastre in federal countries

In favor

- Appropriated (or adaptable) law framework
- National SDI in construction and local initiatives working well
- Professionals well prepared
- Geodetic networks widely spread
- New topic of discussion: "legal coordinates"

Against

- Cadastres and registries are still very "2D oriented"
- Lack of standards between utilities companies and cadastres
- Distance between the public institutions that administrate LLO.

- measuring in 3D, representing and describing in 2D.
- there is a long way to go before 3D information is integrated as part of urban legislation and property titles.
- Changing the term "area" to "space" would be a first step in giving urban and environmental legislation a 3D connotation.
