With an estimated 70% of undocumented land worldwide, increasing effects of climate change, rapid <u>urbanization</u> and increasing competition over land, a limited resource, we are facing several challenges

Addressing the land issues at global, regional, country and city/municipal level is one of the major challenges of our times, both in regard to addressing poverty issues as well as sustainability issues

A competence based volunteer program for Young Surveyors also known as Volunteer Community Surveyor Program (VCSP)

VCSP represents opportunities for young surveyors to touch a particular cause, or bring surveying skills and knowledge to contribute and impact communities through one's volunteered capacity

With an matching the right person with the right skills and knowledge, at the right time, to the right opportunity through GLTN with the overriding aim to achieve greater impact
